

# SNAKES 'N' LADDERS GAME BOARD

## Description

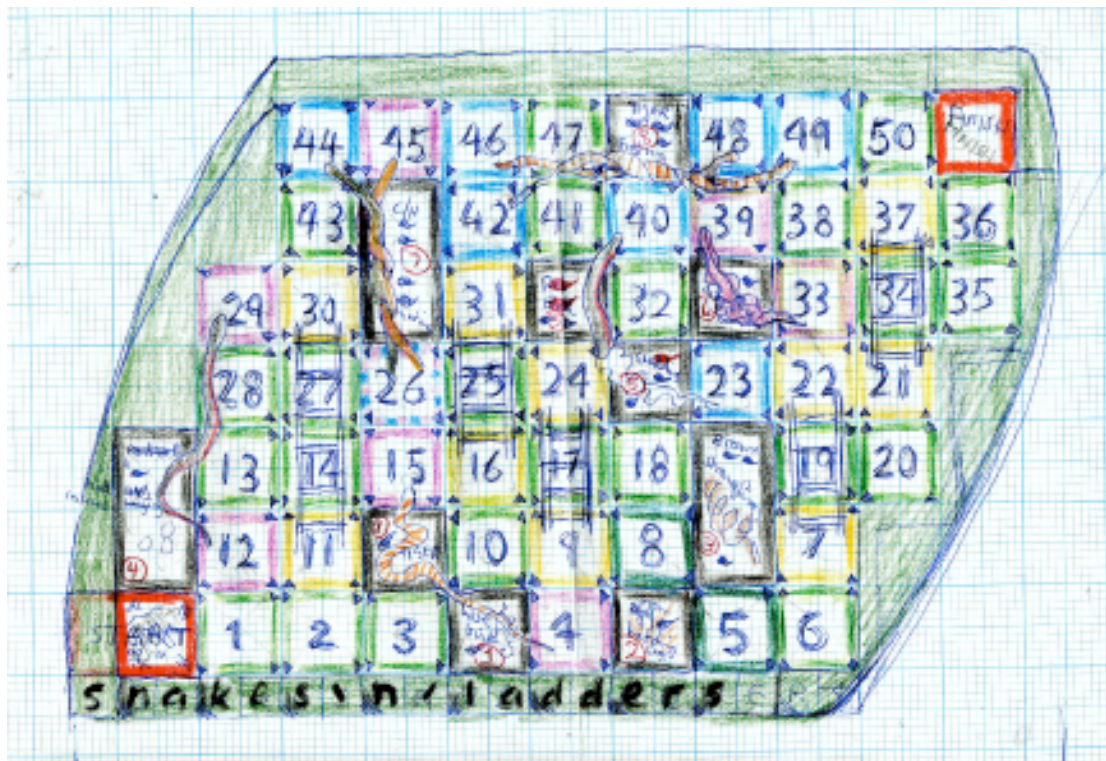
Kathryn Portelli will design, fabricate and install a new public activity board to complement the existing on site chessboard of native wildflowers and the 18 mosaic markers at each mini golf tee.

With consideration to the beautiful natural bush setting and the goal of fun for tourists plus education about our wildlife, the snakes will be depicted closer to actual than as whimsical. The snakes become characters, going about their business and accompanying text information will detail why they do what they do. Players will hop over these areas or slide down if they land on a head. Black and white ladders will take players up to higher numbers. **Scope of Work** - 4.8m x 3.2m walk-on outdoor game board comprising of 65 400 x400mm pavers.

- The local snakes species (Red Bellied Black, Copperhead, Brown and Tiger) will be depicted in their natural activities, birthing, shedding, digesting, fighting and mating
- Each species will be represented twice accompanied by accurate text information tiles
- 5 ladders will be comprised of alternating black and white 25mm glazed tiles
- All coloured borders will be high fired glazed 50mm, corner tiles will have indicator arrows
- START and FINISH will have different colour borders
- The snakes'n'ladders sign will be coloured vitreous glass in ceramic tile background and may be positioned on an overhead roof structure instead of next to the game



**Schedule** - completion in March 2012

All mosaic paver construction will occur in the school term of February and early March, one day per week (probably Mondays).

Installation onto a poured concrete slab will occur mid to late March.
